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

NEW SCULPTURES/NEW SCULPTURE MAIR, NORTH AND PRINT GALLERIES

V@GUE is a major exhibition of new sculpture, bringing together twenty of the country's leading young sculptors. They range in experience from those freshly out of Art School, including many from Christchurch, to those who have represented New Zealand in international exhibitions, such as in Headlands, at the MCA in Sydney, and Distance Looks Our Way at Expo 92 Sevilla.

Many of the artists in VOGUE from Auckland

have not shown in Christchurch before, and so as well as the chance to see works by these artists for the first time, Christchurch artists and audiences can examine Christchurch sculptors in a national context.

The work in V@GUE is highly varied, as are the concerns that the artists are dealing with. The works are tied together by their energy and experimentation, and by the quality of ideas and skills of making that go into them, all of which are highly contemporary, and both intellectually assured and aesthetically stylish in their

approach.

VOGUE has been curated by William McAloon for the CSA.


