Information regarding planned events must be with the co-ordinators by the end of February 1993, but they would appreciate being able to gauge interest as soon as possible.



### IMPERIAL CHINA THE LIVING PAST





The following craftspeople, designers and artists are exhibiting work, most of which is for sale.




## STUDIES AND TENSIONS

New explorations of the nude in art have brought together two artists working in two quite different mediums.

John Badcock, painter, and Michael Deavoll, sculptor, both from Geraldine, have been working together for the past two years with the common theme of the human form. Their work is a personal statement reflecting their growth over this time and the use of the nude in art.


