






OLIVIA SPENCER BOWER FOUNDATION 1994 ART AWARD

This Foundation was set up for the purpose of assisting New Zealand painters and sculptors.

The objects of the Foundation are to encourage and promote painters and sculptors in New Zealand with particular emphasis on future artistic potential. It was the intent of Olivia Spencer Bower to assist artists showing talents so that they could pursue their own particular visual art form for one year freed from the necessity to seek outside employment. The Award is not to be used for overseas travel.

The Award is therefore intended for emerging artists and not established artists.



The value of the 1994 Award will be \$22,000 payable monthly in advance.

Preference is given to artists either with Canterbury connections or willing to work for the Award year in Canterbury.

Lindsay Crooks, Celebrating the New Zealand Worker

LINDSAY CROOKS

W O R K E R There are any number of ways Lindsay Crooks could have chosen to depict something of the subject of work in New Zealand. He could have chosen to hold up a mirror to the depressing reality of a serious unemployment problem, or the grim consequences and effects that the Employment Contracts Act has wrought on the Country's labour force. Instead, Crooks has opted

to depict the New Zealand worker in a way that is both characterisic of his own outlook on life and his art generally. He has adopted a cheerful approach to the topic, and presents New Zealand's workers in all their glory, celebrating their labour and focussing on all that is positive about our many and varied occupations. Positive is a key word for Crooks, it's an attitude he brings to all his work. A graduate of Otago Polytechnic School of Art, Lindsay Crooks has travelled and painted in Australia, England, Europe and the Pacific Islands. He has worked in various mediums, and in recent years, as well as his own work, Crooks has been designing and painting murals. The 'Worker' series paintings have been executed in Watercolour and Pastel on paper.

MICHAEL REED

Since 1970 Michael Reed has exhibited widely in New Zealand. He has had fourteen solo exhibitions and participated in over forty group exhibitions. His work has also been exhibited in Australia, America and Spain. Examples of his artwork are held in public and private collections



in New Zealand as well as private collections in Australia, USA, Canada, Japan, UK, France, Germany, Singapore and Barbadoes. A Queen Elizabeth II Arts Council Major Creative Development Grant in 1991 enabled experimentation in a variety of applications for two dimensional design. Some of the ongoing outcomes are included in the exhibition along with printmaking and mixed media on paper. The main thematic link in the various media, whether design or art orientated, is regional: geographical, environmental, cultural and social aspects of the South Pacific.
