


#### SOUTH CANTERBURY ARTS SOCIETY (INC) 4 1 st ANNUAL EXHIBITION 1993




LANDSCAPE WEEK 1993

#### **PAULINE RHODES** INTENSUM/EXTENSUM

ENERGY GENERATOR II This installation follows INTENSUM - ENERGY GENERATOR FOR POSITIVE ACTION (Image and Issue, Sept '93 - see photograph), and explores the idea of energy generated from a concentrated point and extended in a long narrow spacial situation.

It uses sculptural elements to articulate this idea. From the INTENSUM part of the work in the Front Gallery, the sculptural components extend the energy along the space and up into the

Canaday Gallery, where a free standing EXTENSUM disperses it throughout the space.

"It is an uncommon occurrence to find women exhibiting in the media of textile printing.
