

CONCERT SERIES

During July and August the CSA will be hosting a Sunday afternoon concert series.

The concerts will run between 2 and 4pm, and entry is by programme - \$3.00 per concert. It is anticipated that the series will be supported by The Press, Robert Harris Coffee and the Christchurch Community Arts Council.

The series begins on 3 July with the Garden City Male Voice Choir and Naomi Gee (solo piano). Included in the series will be poetry, jazz, a brass quintet, solo singers and groups, and radio drama.

The final concert on 28 August is An Afternoon with Dylan Thomas and the Cecilian Singers, and the concert at the end of July is called An Afternoon with William Shakespeare, Roger McGough, James K Baxter and Others (Shakespeare in bronze, Baxter in oils and a few living people impersonating themselves or others.)

VISA GOLD ART AWARD

A contemporary Painting Award.
The Visa Gold Art Award has been established to encourage and support New Zealand Painters and to recognise outstanding ability with financial reward, an award ceremony, and an exhibition.

The sole criterion for the national award will be artistic merit.

Prizes include \$15,000 to the winning artist, and 3 x \$1,000 to be awarded at the judges discretion. The award is open to all artists working in the visual medium of painting.







Contributions from Associate Members have again been invited for the Open Exhibition. The Artists committee of the CSA will select the works to be exhibited, and new Working Members will then be chosen form the pieces in this exhibition.

LANDSCAPE by FRAGMENTS

This exhibition features the work of three Christchurch Landscape Architects, all currently involved in the study or teaching of landscape architecture as a discipline, at Lincoln University.

Photography is a means of exploring the particular fascination that the landscape, taken in its widest sense, hold for each of them. Mike Barthelmeh's work, taken mostly in China, Japan and Korea, attempts to capture the essence of place through pattern and detail. Sam Martin's images of the South Island and Californian landscapes focus on the power of the momentary forms of the land, the tree, and the sky, while Katrina Simon's exterior and interior landscapes suggest the power of memory, repetition and the absent past.


CRETE, FIFTY YEARS AFTER works in watercolours and oils

These paintings record places, people and feelings based on a pilgrimage to Crete in 1992. Both my wife's father and my own fought alongside the Cretan people in 1940, and my father is buried, like many other New Zealander's, in an unnamed grave in Soudha Bay. Say why you have come, and the eyes of old people flood with memories of "that terrible time" shared. Even the young are likely to stand up and shake

When we were there, most tourists had gone. Crete waited for 'the greening' - winter rain and snow on the White Mountains.
