
THE DESIGN AND ART COLLEGE OF NEW ZEALAND

The philosophy of the College is to develop each students individual creative design ability and combine this with highly professional technical skills


Each faculty liases closely with related industries/ businesses to enable students to gain knowledge of the requirements and applications of their skills in employment.
