The annual display of our Hire Collection is an ideal opportunity for potential new Hirers to select from the largest collection available for hire in the South Island.


This year we have some new works for hire, purchased with funds raised by the very successful Art Fair which we held in October.





Derek Ball is Senior Lecturer in Sculpture, Otago Polytechnic School of Art. A series of sculptures of the following nature will be on display.



A series of recent images which deal with Canterbury landforms. These landforms are often placed against wide skies and incorporate the gateway - a beginning, an entrance and a means of access.


