For a long time it has been my keen desire to pay respects, in the form of an exhibition, to Petrus van der Velden, and my belief that a worthy tribute was possible—so prodigious was his artistic activity—by assembling some of his work from Christchurch owners. Their kindness in lending is warmly appreciated.

In this retrospective exhibition of the Dutchman's art I have attempted not to concentrate on any one aspect of his work, nor to show equal merit in its variety, but, while opportunity offers, to open many windows on Petrus van

der Velden, the artist and the man.

## P. van der Velden

#### INTRODUCTION

In Christchurch where, in 1890, Petrus van der Velden arrived with his wife and family at the invitation of Mr Gerrit van Asch, his friend and sponsor, we have a special responsibility to ensure permanent recognition of a great painter and remarkable man. We must acquire more examples of his best work for the Robert McDougall Art Gallery and all available written records for its archives. The record must be kept "straight". It would seem that at least three of us in writing have extended the period of his life in Christchurch beyond the actual time of eight years plus visits. Can it be that the impact of his colourful personality made the time seem longer? And Van der Velden, improvident though he was, could have told us whether he received £500 or £400 from the N.S.W. Art Gallery for his large (6' x 8') picture, years in the making and altering, and variously called "Disillusionment". "Disillusioned", or "The Sorrowful Future", and how short a time he and his family lived in holiday luxury on the proceeds. If he could visit our Gallery and not be saddened by the ravages of the bitumen he used in his paint, he would perhaps chuckle as he explained that under "Otira Gorge", No. 55 in this exhibition, lies his painting "The Convalescent", for which his friend, Mr H. Fisher, Senr., was about to offer him 100 guineas and which he painted over because he needed a large canvas immediately. No. 61 is a preliminary study for "The Convalescent".

When, in 1947, Mr H. S. Feast, Town Clerk, had an inquiry from the Netherlands about Van der Velden's career in this part of the world, I wrote, inter alia, "No artist who has left any country to make his home in New Zealand has made such a deep impression. . . . It was New Zealand's gain rather than Van der Velden's when this gifted painter left his native land. . . . In conversation and in notes scribbled in sketch books, he showed himself an interesting philosopher. . . . In Art his favourite dictum was 'Colour is Light'."

A careful assessment of the Art of Van der Velden, written in 1959 by Mr P. A. Tomory, appeared with valuable research material in the catalogue of 30 paintings toured by the Auckland Art Gallery. This included interesting quotations from letters of Van Gogh to his brother in 1883, from which I quote briefly: "He (Van der Velden) is a real artist and I wish I knew him. . . . I know for sure that I should learn from him. . . . He made a very strong impression on me."

The present exhibition is confined to work lent by Christchurch owners and, with the exception of No. 72, no exhibit was shown in the Auckland touring collection.

#### A BRIEF BIOGRAPHY OF VAN DER VELDEN

(Compiled from various sources)

Born in Rotterdam, May 5, 1837. Apprenticed to printer and lithographer-became partner. In 1869 at Academy in Berlin. After 30 years of age chiefly occupied in painting and sketching. (Sketch book in our possession dated 1870.) In 1875 invited by Josef Israels to Join Pulchri Studio Group at The Hague (Israels, Anton Mauve, Mesdag, Wm. and Jacob Maris). In 1880 two pictures at Grosvenor Gallery, London. Reputation became well established in many exhibitions. Goupil Galleries, London, bought a number of his works-watercolours selling for as much as 80 guineas. When in the 1880's he entered "The Dutch Funeral" (now in our Gallery) for exhibition, Josef Israels had his own painting removed from its place of honour in the Amsterdam Gallery and replaced by Van der Velden's, In 1890, aged 53, arrived in New Zealand to stay with Mr Gerrit Van Asch, Sumner, Later had studios in Christchurch. Taught and exhibited. On April 29, 1898, left for Sydney where his first wife died in 1899. Sometime before his return he married again. In hospital in Sydney, Returned to New Zealand in 1905, Lived in Wellington. Was in Christchurch in 1907 on visit and, presumably, on other occasions. A self-portrait, No. 29 in this exhibition is inscribed "Wellington, October 19, 1913". In November, 1913, he went with his wife to Auckland and died on the 10th of that month of a heart attack.
