IKON Inspired Art


105 works from the Wijenburgh Castle, one of the world's largest private collections of medieval Orthodox Church art is coming to Christchurch on September 6 and showing until November 2.

This is a unique opportunity to see these precious and famous works dating from the 5th century and including the fabulous Mother of God icon attributed to Dionisii, the famous Russian icon painter of the early 15th century.

Not just of interest to the scholar, the religious or the art-lover, these beautiful and valuable works have a precious beauty which everyone will be able to recognise. Glowing with rich colours, gleaming gold leaf, silver gilt or cloisonne enamel and sometimes set with precious stones these art works are valued in excess of \$9 million.

Admission

- Fully illustrated and comprehensive book about the exhibition entitled 'Ikon: Inspired Art' will be on sale.
- For each child visitor a full-coloured pamphlet involving a quiz game which indicates and explains the symbolism used in the icons.
- Gallery guides available for a guided tour inside Gallery hours.

Special Evening Parties
