

Guest Exhibitors

Gita Berzins

Graduated Diploma in Fine Arts (Painting) from the University of Canterbury in 1959. As well as painting Gita worked with fabric design, copper repousse and enamelling. In 1978 she realised a lifetime ambition to become a studio potter. Self taught in ceramics, she specialises in handforming techniques. While working mainly for exhibitions, she also tutors for a local pottery group. Becoming increasingly disappointed with the limitations of the glazing process, Gita has recently returned to painting. "Combining the two disciplines by incorporating acrylic paint with the unglazed but fired ceramic forms gives better control and more immediate results. The combination of various disciplines to express an idea is a very rewarding and exciting area for exploration."

George Halliday

George's potting career started with the usual beginners' lessons at the local club in Rangiora. From those early days thirteen or so years ago until today, the properties of clay still have the ability to both fascinate and frustrate. Dur-

ing these years George has attended schools run by various groups and he de-

cided to become a fulltime potter about five years ago.

From his early days with the Rangiora Pottery Group he was introduced to the Leach/Hamada philosophies which seemed to fulfill his own expectations of the craft. The opportunity given by a QEII Arts Council grant to visit Mashiko and study with Shimaoka in 1990 has been the highlight of his potting career to date. This has certainly been his most concentrated learning period. "Not being able to speak Japanese made me use my mind and eyes to analyze their every move. This I found to be an excellent way to learn." On returning to New Zealand George has exhibited his work at the Courtyard Pottery, the Akaroa Gallery and the Cave Rock Gallery.

George likes to make functional pots but he enjoys all forms of claywork and says it never fails to amaze him just how diverse the pottery/ceramic art spectrum has become. He usually salt glazes his pots in a coal and wood fired kiln, but recently he has purchased an LPG kiln and that has opened up a new avenue of learning. 'I believe that the learning process is ongoing for anyone work-

ing with clay, whether it be for recreation or to earn a living.

David Walker

Was born in North Canterbury in 1957. He began a career in ceramics in 1983 after travelling for three years in Asia and Europe. Returning to New Zealand to live in Nelson, he spent a three year apprenticeship Don Auchinvole, gaining experience in all aspects of running a professional studio pottery wholesaling and retailing large amounts of domestic ware.

David found the Nelson craft environment, meeting and learning from other creative people, invaluable for putting certain ideals into perspective. From the examples of achievment and encouragement from others, Nelson offered the stimulation to overcome all the odds in an attempt to earn a living from the

arts.

Seeing Banks Peninsula as similar in character to the Nelson region, with the possibility of it being an easier place to survive as a newly self-employed potter, David moved to Akaroa in 1986 and established Nettle Creek Pottery. Drawing on a background in painting and illustration, and using skills learned in producing repetitive domesticware, David now places more emphasis on work with a decorative only nature, seeing this type of work fulfill a specific function in a symbolic and personal value-giving context. "It performs the same role as painting and exists outside the framework of domestic useage. This direction has led to a close partnership between painting and pottery in the expoloration of aesthetics and imagination."
