KELVIN BRADFORD

Clay is such a superb medium and in many ways I believe is undervalued within NZ. My first introduction to clay was though Len Castle who would become my mentor. I would visit him and borrow books from his private collection and in those days there was a magnificent collection of ancient pieces in Auckland Museum. I immediately identified with asymmetry and natural effects. Eventually this lead to me developing the shell-fired technique which has since been taught in Australia, Germany, Japan.

My exhibitions in Japan have given me a great insight into their clay world and the 'tea bowl' and recently I have returned to 'Shino' which has fascinated most potters from time to time.


