Venue: Education Centre, Christchurch Art Gallery Te Puna o Waiwhetū

Cost: \$10 per student per day. Schools will be charged upon booking (EFTPOS available). All materials will be provided.

Numbers: Max. 20 students per workshop. Limit of 2 students per school per day, to bring together like-minded art students from a variety of schools. Additional students will be waitlisted.

Lunch: Students will need to bring their own lunch and snacks, and arrange their own transport to and from Christchurch Art Gallery. They are not required to wear their uniforms.

Roll: A roll will be taken at the start of each workshop and after lunch to ensure all students are in attendance. Teachers are welcome to drop in during the week to see how the workshops are progressing.

Presented by Fatu Feu'u Monday 10 May

A fantastic opportunity to learn from one of Aotearoa New Zealand's most respected Pasifika artists. Working across a range of media. Fatu draws inspiration from Polynesian art forms. Fa'asamoa the Samoan way - is the unifying element of his work. Fatu will talk about his work and his journey as an artist as he takes students through the processes of drawing, painting and woodblock, creating a series of works to keep.

Creating is... Context

Presented by Matt Akehurst Tuesday 11 May

In this workshop, students will complete a series of drawing activities that explore public art, thinking about the context of making and what you need to consider when making a public work. Students will build on their ideas by creating three-dimensional works using a range of materials. The workshop will encourage students to build and experiment. Matt's practice looks at the contextual framework of the art world and encompasses sculpture, video and drawing.

Creating is... Transformation

Presented by Audrey Baldwin Thursday 13 May

Students will examine everyday objects and actions, think about how we ascribe meaning to them and explore how this can translate into sculpture and/or performance. Using discussion, humour and absurdity as creative processes, students will be encouraged to transform the everyday into art that is strange yet insightful. Audrey's practice incorporates performance, installation and public activations, questioning the everyday and reframing how we engage with the banal and what it tells us about society.

Creating is... Identity

Presented by Nina Oberg-Humphries Friday 14 May

Students will be guided through works in Te Wheke by artist Nina Oberg-Humphries. She will discuss the history behind two Pacific artifacts and how adornment reflects value, mana and identity throughout the Pacific. Students will expand on these ideas by creating their own adornments that reflect what makes them uniquely them. Nina is a multimedia artist whose work explores the juxtaposition between cultural tradition and popular culture to create a visual language that represents the artist as a second generation New Zealand-born Pacific Islander.
