## E"Oreveroral

The Tenth Exhibition sees the pottery movement in this country firmly established. We have our own traditions and our own masters, aesthetically, philosophically and technically. Much of the pioneering and the excitement is over. The hard core is settling down to serious work and the unable-to-be-so-committed are proving that they too can produce good pots. We have a new generation of potters developing who, because of the more favourable climate, reach in a few years standards the older ones took three times as long to accomplish.
In many ways the development of the potters towards maturity parallels the cultural development of the country in which we live. As New Zealanders grow in appreciation and understanding the potters are able to give them something to enjoy made from our common environment for our own way of living.

With this Annual Exhibition, alternating as it does between the four main centres, and containing a fair cross section of the work being done throughout the country, we are able to take a good long look at what is going on and to assess our strengths and weaknesses.
An Exhibition of such magnitude can only be staged with the goodwill and co-operation of a large number of people. It demonstrates not only that New Zealanders produce pots that come up to world standard but also that they enjoy working together for a common end. This Exhibition, then, merits serious consideration, not only as a display of art and craft, but also as a spontaneous expression of what the creative New Zealander is.
