

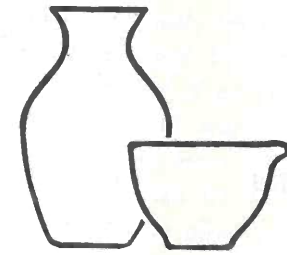

## FOREWORD

By O. C. Stephens

As the N.Z. Potters' Exhibition has been held each year since 1957, it is now possible to form some judgment on the development of Pottery-making in New Zealand. In the early exhibitions there was shown a tremendous improvement. The number of potters working in New Zealand increased at a phenomenal rate . . . our knowledge of pottery-making as a craft was stimulated greatly by the visit of Bernard Leach and later by Takeichi Kawai and Shoji Hamada. These last two were representatives of an older civilisation of potters who learned the possibilities of their materials by trial and error, by keen observation and comparison. In so doing they learned more and more the response they could expect from their raw materials by various handling and firing techniques. In the hand-made pot the effort, both mental and physical, that has gone into its making should give it an individuality and a quality of its own. Added to this, of course, is the visual appeal of colour, line and texture.

These early potters of the Korean, Tang, Sung and Ming times, and later the Japanese, considered the composition and texture of the stoneware body so important that they left the lower part of the pot unglazed so that the body could be admired as well as the glazed surface. The stoneware must be non-porous or else, as in earthenware, the glaze must cover the body to seal it. If the stoneware body is underfired, then it may be porous and then it is not stoneware. In earthenware the glaze must seal a slightly porous body, and the danger here is that the glaze may craze and so let water seep through the body. So we must guard against underfired stoneware and crazed earthenware—bearing in mind the fact that crazed glaze on stoneware is sometimes used as decoration.

There is no doubt that further advances in the quality of pottery made in New Zealand is dependent on the continuing experimentation with new ideas and new techniques. There are signs that some of our potters are continuing to use the same techniques and the same type of kiln-firing. Other potters are learning from them and so there is tending a lack of variety and a loss of the enchantment that the N.Z. exhibition should bring. Let us all try to lift the artistry of New Zealand pots and the quality of body and glaze to higher levels so that we can compare favourably with any in the world.
