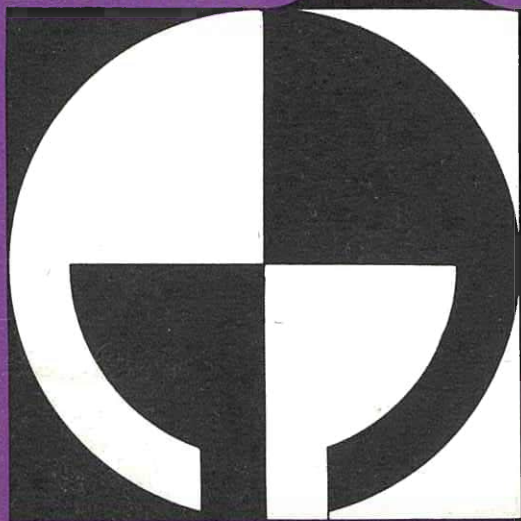

Foreword

Craft in the post Morris situation is not just a stage in technological development where technique and creativity happen to be in unison. This is how things sometimes were before the industrial revolution, but now certain social implications are also involved, and these provide the reason d'être of craft, which above all is something which stands in opposition to the mercenary principles which motivate present day society.

This is why I felt it necessary to prepare a foreword to such exhibitions as May and I held during the Crowan and Crewanna periods, in order to elaborate to the socio-philosophic implications of what we were trying to do.

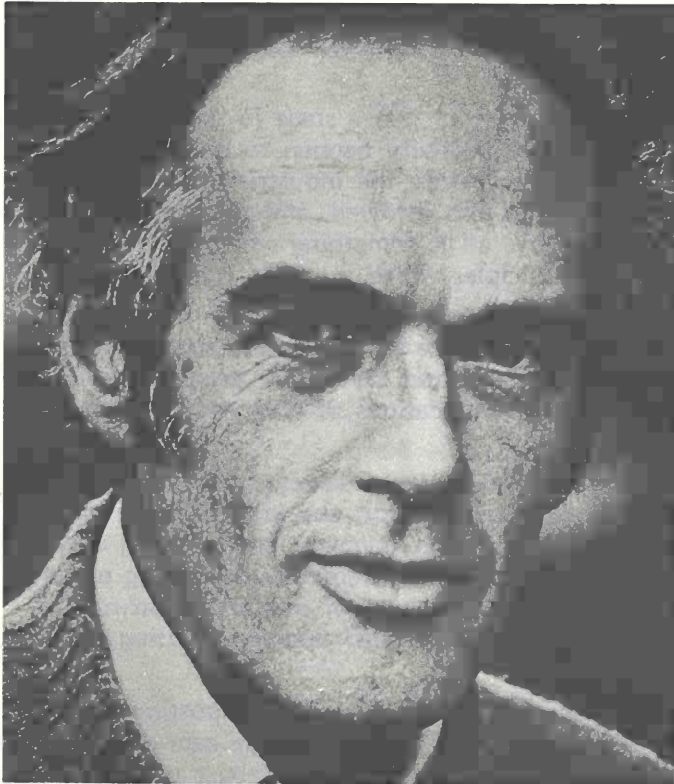
After two and a half years away from New Zealand I was struck by the astonishing growth of the potting community, and after meeting the potters in 14 centres I began to ask myself what might be the meaning of this. I was also struck by the prevalence of the premature marketing of pots which did not seem to endorse the principles of this attack on money values any more than the now well established practice of using price as a lever to status.

In defence of premature marketing it is often said that potting is an expensive hobby and without selling what one makes one cannot do it. This is clearly evidence that the potting movement is in danger of being engulfed by the commercial ethos which surrounds it. A glance at the advertisements in any of the now numerous Craft magazines shows clearly enough that this vulture is well and truly poised for action, and explains why the craft of potting has become an expensive hobby. This is in fact just another instance of the price of urbanism, and it is significant that real potters in non-urban situations often make fine pots entirely outside the world of money economics. I should add perhaps that making pots for a living even in present day society is not necessarily the same thing as being a commercial potter, an idea which I find needs proof and explanation again and again.

When writing a foreword to ones own exhibition one can explain ones motivation in socio-philosophic terms, but when asked to write a foreword to an exhibition such as this, which is the work of a whole community, one cannot explain, one can only pose questions. I suggest that this is perhaps a moment when questions should be asked among the potters in an effort to recall the motivation of those potters who began this series of National Exhibitions nearly twenty years ago.

Born 1930. Studied painting at Camberwell School, London, 1948, Scholar Kings College, Cambridge, 1949-52. Historical research 1953. Studied Pottery, Central School, London, 1954-55. Founded Aldermaston Pottery, 1955. Published the book "Tin Glaze Pottery" 1973. Chairman of British Craft Centre from 1973. Exhibited throughout Great Britain, in U.S.A., Japan, Turkey and Australia. Winner of Lions Club Prize. Faenza, 1970. Ballardini Prize, Faenza 1971.

"Standing quite alone, and for that reason sometimes left out of account, Alan Caiger-Smith directs his energy to ornamentation of pottery forms in the majolica tradition. If other potter had his ability to handle a brush and fill a space with lively pattern decoration, then painting on pottery would not be so close to extinction in Britain. Not for him the contemplative oriental brushwork, but rather the near-symmetry and abstract pattern of Moorish and Persian designs. His recent experiments in Persian lustre are entirely appropriate and his work lies comfortably within the traditional frame of useful ware without having lost its ability to give joy and exhilaration."

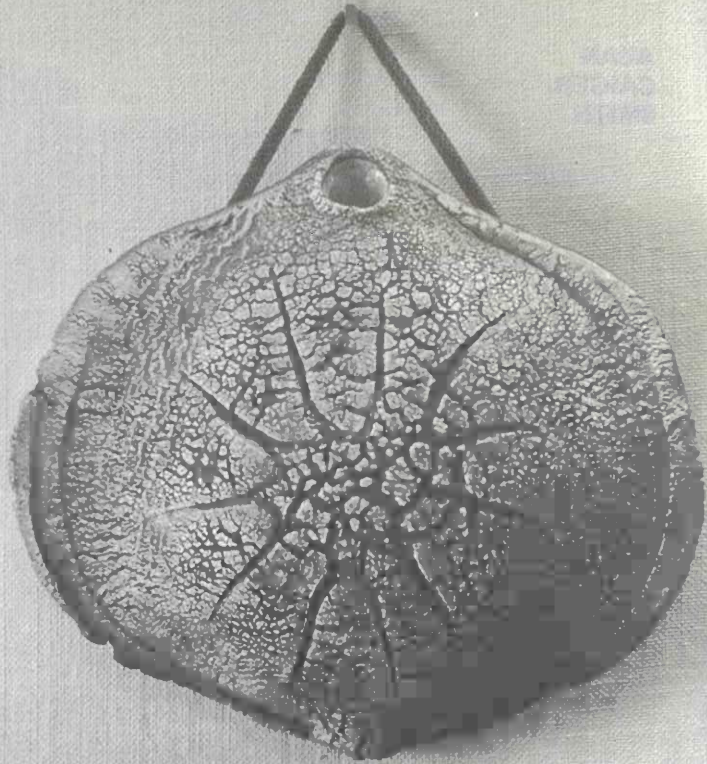
