**Purchased Pots** Must be collected from the Auckland War Memorial Museum Exhibition Hall. Sunday 21st November, Mon. 22nd. or Tues. 23rd.

New Zealand potting has come a long way, both aesthetically and technically, in a comparatively short time. It has been praised by many imformed overseas visitors and also by New Zealanders in a position to judge. The question now asked by many potters, perhaps a little self-consciously, is - "Where do we go from here?". Of course, there is no specific answer; we just advance and in various directions according to personal beliefs by experiment and develop-

ment. Much of this development must come from our personal resources, but this may be the best possible thing.

It is often deplored that New Zealand is so far from the main cultural streams of the world, but this could well be an advantage rather than otherwise. Is such communication an essential requirement of creative development? Creative potting is an extremely personal and individual craft and the Sung potters managed to establish standards with very much less cultural communication than New Zealand enjoys.

In fact, does not this remoteness give us time to analyse, to accept, to absorb or reject without being carried away by all the fashions, fads and -isms that beset the international world of craft today. This is not to suggest that we become traditionalists. Experiment we must but it has to be within the boundaries of good taste and the difficulty always is to define this commodity which does not submit to a vardstick. It is so easy, quoting Bernard Leach, to produce "virtuosity without virtue".

Perhaps one standard to apply is a quality found in all good pots - the quality of timelessness. Bernard Leach pots would live as gracefully in a mediaeval hall as in a modern home. Lucie Rie is as much pre-dynastic as pro Bond Street. Shoji Hamada's work ranges from Tang to today, and tomorrow. Hans Coper is perhaps something of a paradox, a sophisticated primitive whose pots would have graced a Greek temple as successfully as Coventry Cathedral.

Here perhaps lies one lesson in our search for standards; that although we must each produce entirely original and personal work as befits individual minds and hands, that although our work must always be experimental and constantly changing, it must in its fundemental rightness always be capable of transcending change! It would be a false thing to pompously pot for posterity, but an attempt to infuse some quality of timeless good taste into our pots may enable us to escape the worse fate of exhibitionistic potting which seems to have overtaken much of the American and modern Japanese potters in particular in their frantic race to keep up with the cultural Jones's.

## KENNETH CLARK

Born in Wellington 1922. Remained in U.K. after the War, studying at Slade School of Fine Arts and Central School, as well as gaining experience in country workshops and potteries.

Later set up his own studio in Central London and taught part time at Goldsmith's College of Art, Central School of Arts and Crafts and Camberwell School of Arts. Together with his wife Ann Wyn Reeves, he developed a range of decorative tiles as well as moving into the field of architectural ceramics in which much research was carried out into coloured glazes - little used at the time.

Kenneth Clark now employs seven people in his pottery, using a wide range of techniques from hand decorating to slip casting, jigger and jolly, screen printing, tile pressing and casting, resulting in a continual flow of well made hand decorated wares, together with commissioned designs, projects and murals. He has had a book published "Practical Pottery and Ceramics" now in its second edition and apart from running the London studio, does part time industrial designing for silver and other media.

Kenneth Clark was specifically invited to submit to this Exhibition a selection of decorated earthenware in the colours for which his pottery has become famous.
