Many words have been strongly spoken and recorded on the vexed question of selection during the New Zealand Society of Potters twenty five years of existence. The minute book reveals many opinions and many approaches which have been addressed to the question of selection of potters for membership of our National Society. That question has been resolved for four years now; there is no selection for membership! The selection of pots for our Annual National Exhibition however, continues to give us stimulus for change, if not improvement, to the system.

At present the Executive of the National Society of Potters is considering whether or not its present system of "regional" selection of pots does in fact give us what we consider the appropriate prestige to our members resulting in a truly representative and excellent exhibition of the work presently created by the potters of this country. My personal feeling on this subject is that we have come to yet another need for change. We are a growing society and should welcome any effort to live up to our Constitution. We need continuing stimulus to work for excellence and to provide the appropriate vehicle to entice **all** our potters to exhibit regularly; a worthwhile challenge.

There is another Annual Exhibition in New Zealand which manages to have a single selector at a single venue. It also asks for only one work per potter. The result has always been controversial, but very tight and exciting. Overseas, exhibitions of prestige are often shown in Art Galleries and Museums where none of the work is on sale — perhaps the true meaning and concept of exhibition, and thus putting the pots out of the realm of a "sale of work".

There are indeed as many ideas as ever about selection of pots for our National Exhibition. Whilst healthy discussion inside and outside the society's executive continues, almost as a tradition, we are pleased to have commenced dialogue with the Art Gallery Directors Council on this subject. We hope that their particular skills will be able to assist the Society on perhaps its next growth phase.

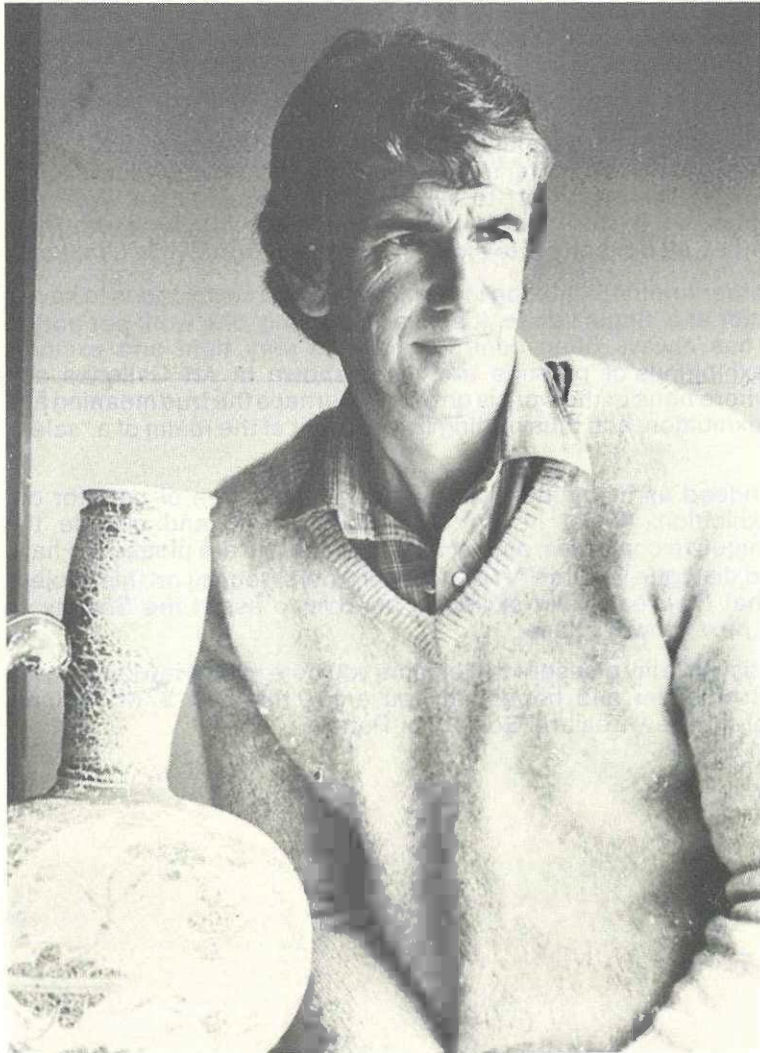

GUEST POTTER

Alan Peascod from Canberra, Australia, born in 1943 in England. His recent pots are a combination of superb lustrous surfaces and imaginative forms. A strong influence on Alan's work has been ancient pottery and research scholarships have enabled him to travel and study ceramics in the Middle East, India, West Germany and England.

Alan was represented in the International Collection of Ceramics 1972, in the Victoria and Albert Museum, London, and the Concorso Internazionale Della Ceramica in Faenza, in 1974 and 1975, and has exhibited in the main cities of Australia. He is represented in the permanent collections of many galleries throughout Australia including the National Galleries of Victoria, Canberra, Queensland, Tasmania, Southern Australia and Western Australia, the Commonwealth Loan Collection and the Crafts Victoria Collection.
