SELECTOR PROFILE

COLLETT WAATA-URLICH







Colleen is an accomplished potter and clay artist. She has devoted a great deal of her time to teaching, mentoring and promoting other Maori clay artists. She was made an Officer of the New Zealand Order of Merit for services to Maori art in the 2015 honours list

To quote; "No one ever gets by, by themselves. My iwi, my marae, Toi Maori Aotearoa, Nga Kaihanga Uku, particularly the Artists Collective of Te Tai Tokerau, this is really a recognition for all those people."

She is a trained teacher and developed her interest in clay while doing an art major at Auckland Teachers College. She holds a Master of Fine Arts (hons) from Elam School of Fine Arts and a Bachelor of Applied Arts from Tai Tokerau Polytech and has established and led various art departments.

Colleen is committed to using local materials and low technology. Symbols originating from taniko designs referring to moisture, or from carving referring to fertility or guardianship, are used to pattern her work. She also uses feather, muka fibre and corn husks to decorate, along with paua shell or ceramic beads.

Colleen is also the founding curator of Toi Ngapuhi, now the largest exhibition of Ngapuhi and Maori arts in New Zealand, and the flagship of the Ngapuhi Festival in Kaikohe.



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SELECTOR PROFILE

CARL PEVERALL









Although now practicing as a multi-media artist, Carl first trained in ceramics and says, "I use clay, fired in the raku medium to express a very personal language, that draws upon eclectic influences like quantum physics, the architecture of Antoni Gaudi and the sublime elemental sculpture of Isamu Noguchi. My intention is to follow my own creative muse with integrity.

Contrasting the labour intensive studio work, I continue to be seduced by a love for the landscape which I consummate by painting on location, primarily in pastel. In doing so, there is an opportunity to recharge by stepping outside the studio and my 'self' through a direct connection with nature.

Most recently I have begun to work, not just from nature, but with nature, by making stone sculpture. These new works materialise dreams that began over 20 years ago while hiking through Rockland County by the Hudson River."


